Why were the disciples slow to believe?

Norval Geldenhuys wrote, From the Gospel account of the Resurrection, it is as clear as daylight that nothing and no one except the risen Jesus Himself convinced His perplexed followers of the fact that he had indeed arisen. Even the testimony of the angels, of the women, of Peter and of the men of Emmaus was not sufficient to reassure the rest completely. ... the final reassurance came only when Jesus himself appeared to them and banished all doubt.
