Knowing and Following Jesus

At Greyfriars Mt Eden and Epsom

Jesus called his followers to be disciples and in our church, we seek to obey Jesus by being, making and growing disciples.

What is a disciple?

In Jesus' day a disciple was a **student** who learned from a teacher. We see in the New Testament the example of Jesus' disciples who listened to his teaching and followed the example he set for them.

In our church we speak of a disciple as a person who:

Knows Jesus – has begun a spiritual relationship with him **Follows Jesus** – follows his example and teaching.

The mission of our church is **to help people to know and follow Jesus**. We would like to help you to know and follow him!

A help description of a disciple is a person who is FOR Jesus:

Follows Jesus – (Matt 4.19; Matt 9.9, John 10.1-4 & 14-16) Obeys Jesus – (John 14.15 & 21) Remains in Jesus – (John 15.1-8, Gal 2.20, Col 2.6)

A disciple should be constantly growing spiritually and being transformed to be more like Jesus, (2 Cor 3.18). In our church we expect that spiritual transformation to change us so we become spiritually mature and our lives are increasingly spiritually healthy. This spiritual health is seen in disciples who are:

Living in Love
Growing in Faith
Uniting in Purpose
Devoted in Worship
Sharing in Fellowship
Proclaiming the Gospel
Serving with Compassion

No one is transformed overnight, it takes time as we learn from Jesus,

Following the model of his life
Obeying the commands he has given us
Remaining connected to him as our source of life.

People who chose to follow Jesus:

must intentionally decide to apply themselves to learning from Jesus and applying his truth in their lives. In this way we take responsibility for our own spiritual growth.

must be part of his church and build relationships with other disciples. In this way we take responsibility for helping each other in our spiritual growth.

Before ascending to heaven Jesus gave the great commission to his disciples saying,

All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age. Matt 28:18-20

In these verses we see three key stages of discipleship.

- **1)** *Make disciples* this points to conversion, becoming a Christian, starting the Christian life. In John's Gospel Jesus spoke of this as being *born again* (John 3.3).
- **2)** Baptising them this points to being identified with Jesus and with his people. Baptism is a sign of becoming a disciple of Jesus and a member of his church (Acts 2.38-41).

3) *Teaching them to obey* – this point to our responsibility to follow the commands and teaching of Jesus (Rom 6.26, 1John 5.2-3)

Our church is committed to helping you in your journey of faith.

We have developed a *Road Map* to help you with this journey. (you can find the *Road Map* at the end of this booklet).

The journey begins when you accept Jesus as your Lord and Saviour.

You do this by:

confessing your wrongdoing to Jesus, asking him to forgive you, trusting in and receiving the forgiveness he offers you and allowing him to be the boss of our lives.

Early in this journey you will join the church by baptism (or if you have already been baptised as an infant, by confirmation or affirmation of baptism).

We will help you to grow as a disciple by

Accepting you into the faith community and giving you a place to belong spiritually.

Providing life changing church services, where by prayer, bible reading, preaching, worship and joining with others in the sacraments you will nurture your faith.

Teaching you to how to pray and get the most out of your bible

Expecting you to join a growth group (meeting with a small group of disciples) where together you:

will explore and discuss the teaching of Jesus develop supportive, trusting relationships

find practical ways to serve others and apply what you have learned.

Encouraging you to stretch your faith by:

attending great courses like *Discipleship Explored* attending seminars which are occasionally held at church


reading Christian books that are available in our church library.
